

Persons Still in Prison or Executed for June 4th-related Offences

Following is a list of people who are believed to still be in prison for offences related to the 1989 Democracy Movement. Some of these prisoners are due for release around the time of the 15th anniversary. The list also includes people who were executed for alleged offences during the protests. The offences include not only political crimes such as "counterrevolutionary" offences, but also "hooligan" offences such as robbery, arson and assault.

In a letter to President Bill Clinton in 1998, HRIC observed of these "hooligans" that, "For the most part they are people who were seen on television screens around the world in May 1989, marching in the streets, blocking the path of the troops entering the city with improvised barricades, running through the streets on the night of June 3-4, and throwing rocks and paving stones at tanks and armed personnel carriers. Many are thought to have been detained merely because they were out on the streets. In general, these people were brought to trial more quickly and received more severe sentences than did the prominent students and intellectuals who were arrested."

Similarly, Amnesty International observed in 1998, "Most of those charged with such offences were summarily tried while Martial Law was still in force in Beijing during the seven months which followed the 4 June massacre. They usually received very harsh sentences, often totally disproportionate with the offences they allegedly committed. Many were reportedly tortured to extract confessions and may have been wrongly convicted."

The information presented here is accurate as far as can be ascertained from available information. However, it is possible that some prisoners were released early, or died during their incarceration. In addition, it should be noted that there are probably many more people who could be included on the list, but whose fate has never become public. Prisoners are listed according to length of sentence, locality, and alphabetically by name, but maintaining the unity of groups arrested and convicted together. In the case of sentences of death suspended for two years, it is assumed that these sentences were eventually commuted to life, in accordance with normal practice.
